During the course students learn to recognize and to offer first aid to several life-threatening emergencies: unconsciousness, wounds, bleeding, burns, bone fractures, anaphylactic reactions, etc. The important part of course is Basic and Advanced Life Support in Adults and Children based on the 2010 guidelines and AED.

#### 3. Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery

**Course Description:** A major goal of Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery is (1) tissue transfer from the other parts of the body, or (2) medical application of fabricated tissues in order for the augmentation or replacement of congenitally defective, impaired, injured, or otherwise damaged human tissue. Today, the progress of microsurgery influenced the present practice significantly in tissue transfer, while the tissue engineering has made significant advances in the design and development of such biologic tissues as bladder, aorta, skin, muscle, cartilage, and tendon. These engineered tissues have been studied in many respects with regard to their close correlation and biocompatibility with their natural tissue counterparts, their bio-stability and integration into host material, and their ultimate restoration of normal structure and function characteristics. With regard to connective tissue and more specifically to bone and cartilage, our laboratory has demonstrated that phalanges and ear can be formed by tissue engineering. And the results has indicated that this approach is a promising one toward a more complete tissue-engineered fabrication of bone and cartilage with its potential clinical applications in the field of Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery in the near future. Both surgical techniques such as microsurgery and tissue engineering have made inroads into recent surgical developments in the variety of surgical procedures in the field of Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery and Hand Surgery. This course presentation introduces update in our current clinical and research investigations in the plastic and reconstructive surgery, microsurgery, hand surgery, and tissue engineering (regenerative medicine).

# 4. PRISHTINA VIVARIUM, temporary architectures and elective community

**Teaching Method:** Classroom lectures, site visits and guided tours, participatory design, laboratory DIY with recy-cled materials, public exhibition of the project

**Course Description:** The contemporary transformation of the city display a profound redrawing of the contours of public and private spaces. This produce a vigorous debate in architecture and urbanism on the transformation of public space: discourses that lamented "the end of public spaces", or other contrasting opinions that advocated new forms of public space for collective use, with processes and movements of occupation of squares and streets. The city become a Vivarium, a breeding ground to experiment new Commons. PRISHTINA VIVARIUM, temporary architectures and elective community devices. The course will aim to investigate which spaces of Prishtina are now empty, abandoned or underutilized, which populations of Prishtina can reactivate the public space and to realize one temporary project in situ. Today which elective community can redefine a space as a public good? Students will experiment and realize some intervention devices like interviews with local stakeholders, achieve a coordinated signage and graphics, designing of temporary infrastructures and architectures that will enable groups of concerned citizens - the elective communities- to turn on a six-month program of activities and events related to art, sport, community gardening, music... During the two weeks the students, with the support of local artists and experts, will realize a temporary architecture as a Prishtina Vivarium of public space.

# 5. Diplomacy and Intercultural Communication

**Teaching Method:** Teaching methods will combine moments of lecture with moment of discussion about concrete aspects of gender discriminations and the way they can affect both sexes. It will be also relevant to compare recent gender indicators from several countries in subthemes as vertical and horizontal segregation in professional areas, salary gap, glass ceilings, the underrepresentation of girls in sciences, etc.

Course Description: Social organization is based in what can be called a 'gender order', which has different implications for men and women in several domains of daily life and across the lifespan. Despite some of these implications can be seen as normative in a given specific culture, many of them are clearly negative for both sexes in concrete areas, as domesticity, professional world, identity, to name just a few. All professionals of education and training must be aware that gender discriminations are structural to societies and that these gender discriminations can even reach a greater level of complexity when crossed with other categories used to classify individuals, like ethnicity, school level, sexual orientation, age, socioeconomic status, among others. These other types of discriminations should also receive a strong attention and should be counteracted by all people who have educational responsibilities to others, but being a woman or a man comes before all other affiliations.

Scientific research has shown that boys and girls tend to be socializated differently by parents, teachers, and other educational agents from very early ages and these differential strategies and messages may constitute real obstacles for them when it is time to decide about vocational choices, about the conflict work-family, about having or not an active political involvement in society, etc. In fact, these apparently subtle inequalities continue to contaminate the way men and women exercise their citizenship and how they perceive themselves as part of a fully democratic society. So, it is important the integration of gender dimension in the formal educational practices and in the organizational dynamics of educational institutions with the intention to combat gender stereotypes that predefine what is supposed to do and be a girl and a boy. Based on the structural axis of gender relations, I believe that this strategy will promote a true freedom of choice for professional and academic backgrounds and life projects by either girls or boys.

Course Description: This course will provide students with a greater understanding of the biological and ethical issues surrounding the use of assisted reproductive technologies in animals and human. The course has been designed to accommodate students with varying backgrounds in the biological sciences, including those with limited background, in order to attract persons with diverse interests and experiences. Topics to be discussed during this course include (but are not limited to) an introduction to ethics, an overview of ethical theories, and numerous topics pertaining to assisted reproductive technologies such as reproductive anatomy and physiology, regulation of reproductive cycles, artificial ensemination, embryo transfer, in vitro fertilization, gender selection, somatic cell nuclear transfer ("cloning"), and embryonic stem cells. Attendance at, active participation in, and professionalism of discussion during this course will be expected from all students.

# 13. Modern approaches to conflict prevention and conflict resolution

**Teaching Method:** Lectures, debates (based on text-reading), seminar work, oral presentations (defending students solutions in front of professors and colleagues)

Course Description: The field of conflict prevention and conflict resolution has many sources, including the academic disciplines of political science, international relations, psychology, sociology, anthropology, biology, economics, mathematics, and law. Other sources include the long history of domestic labor-management disputes and negotiation; the civil rights movement; and other work on racial, community, and domestic ethnic conflict (US Institute of Peace).

The course will firstly address the definitional, methodological and epistemological questions of the "theory of conflict prevention" and "theory of conflict resolution". After defining the conceptual framework of conflict prevention and conflict resolution, the so called "traditional approaches" to conflict prevention and conflict resolution will be explained (as conducted mostly by international organizations and states in the framework of the Charter of the United Nations, Art. 33: negotiation, enquiry, mediation, conciliation, arbitration, judicial settlement, resort to regional agencies or arrangements). On this basis, new approaches in conflict prevention and resolution will be explained in details, as these approaches have gained credibility and usability after the end of the Cold War, particularly because they might be supportive or in some cases more appropriate means for prevention and/or resolution of certain conflicts. in this regard, the course will shed light on the non-traditional security actors in conflict prevention and conflict resolution, e. g. non-governmental organizations, civil society actors, the media, religious institutions, certain individuals, business sector etc. At the end, the students will try to use the new approaches in the framework of on-going conflicts in Southeastern Europe (SEE), and in this regard – as a last step – even develop certain proposals how the conflicts in SEE could be overcome by using the new approaches.

Course Description: In this course we deal with a useful and powerful tool in enumerative combinatorics, namely generating functions. This tool not only helps us to derive formulas from recurrence relation, but can be used directly to count number of objects in a sequence of sets. Once you get the hang of this tool, we guarantee you will see how fun and addicting these problems can be. Generating functions are formal power series, and we will discuss the theory of formal power series after starting the definitions and some basic examples. Throughout the course we will use two types of generating functions, ordinary and exponential. Also, we will present examples that describe how to convert an ordinary generating function to exponential generating function.
